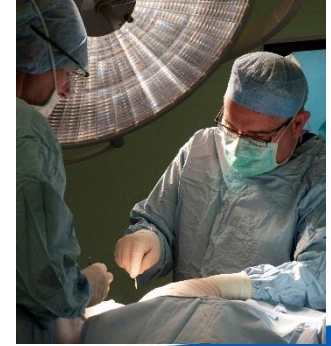

Integrated Care Systems: A reminder

- In 2018 Gloucestershire became a wave 2 integrated care system and established the partnership known as 'One Gloucestershire'.
- Working in this way over the last few years has given us an opportunity to deliver more joined up care and support for residents and given us greater flexibility and control to make local decisions about services
- The Health and Care Bill (currently going through Parliament) is proposing to formalise these arrangements and put ICS' on a statutory footing from April 2022



Integrated Care Systems: A reminder

- In practice this will mean a move away from competition / a focus on individual organisations – to enabling more collaboration between partners.
- It will support further work to integrate services and improve population health.



Gloucestershire of course has already been working in this way for many years – but changes will give exciting opportunities for further partnership working and enable us to provide services that meet local needs (eg. potential for more direct commissioning).

- ICS' will be made up of two key bodies – an Integrated Care Board and Integrated Care Partnership



Integrated care systems (ICSs)

Key planning and partnership bodies from April 2022

NHS England

Performance manages and supports the NHS bodies working with and through the ICS

Care Quality Commission

Independently reviews and rates the ICS

Statutory ICS

Integrated care board (ICB)

Membership: independent chair; non-executive directors; members selected from nominations made by NHS trusts/foundation trusts, local authorities and general practice

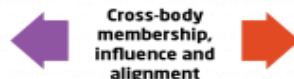
Role: allocates NHS budget and commissions services; produces five-year system plan for health services



Integrated care partnership (ICP)

Membership: representatives from local authorities, ICB, Healthwatch and other partners

Role: planning to meet wider health, public health and social care needs; develops and leads integrated care strategy but does not commission services



Partnership and delivery structures

Geographical footprint

System

Usually covers a population of 1-2 million

Place

Usually covers a population of 250-500,000

Neighbourhood

Usually covers a population of 30-50,000

Name

Participating organisations

Provider collaboratives

NHS trusts (including acute, specialist and mental health) and as appropriate voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations and the independent sector; can also operate at place level

Health and wellbeing boards

ICS, Healthwatch, local authorities, and wider membership as appropriate; can also operate at system level

Place-based partnerships

Can include ICB members, local authorities, VCSE organisations, NHS trusts (including acute, mental health and community services), Healthwatch and primary care

Primary care networks

General practice, community pharmacy, dentistry, opticians

What are we doing to support transition?

- Work is underway within Gloucestershire to support the closure of the CCG and establishment of arrangements from April 2022. All of the work we are undertaking is subject to approval of the Health and Care Bill.
- This is being coordinated through an ICS Transition Group that with system partners is helping to facilitate this transition. Workstreams established are outlined below.

System Support and Development



Timeline so far...

- November 2020 - NHS England and NHS Improvement (NHSEI) launch engagement exercise
- February 2021 - Government published [Whitepaper](#) setting out proposals for a Health and Care Bill
- June 2021 - The [ICS Design Framework](#) sets out the next stage of ICS Development
- July 2021 - First and second reading of the Health and Care Bill in Parliament
- July 2021 - Dame Gill Morgan [confirmed as Chair designate](#) of Gloucestershire Integrated Care Board (ICB)
- August 2021 - Further implementation guidance issued by NHS England
- October 2021 – Transition to Launch Comms and Engagement Plan agreed for Gloucestershire

Future Timeline:

- October/November 2021 – Recruitment to ICB Chief Executive Officer for Gloucestershire
- Through to April 2022 – Communications and engagement work with public, partners & staff
- End of October, end of December and mid-February – Submission of our plans for how the ICS will operate from April
- 3rd December – Submission of draft constitution including ICB governance arrangements
- By mid January – ICB Executive posts and Non-Executive Directors appointed
- Mid January – Board Strategy session
- January – Staff TUPE consultation and transfer arrangements to the ICB in line with the employment commitment to staff
- By mid-March - System decision making arrangements confirmed and due diligence completed on CCG closure and ICB establishment ready
