## 1. Background

- 1.1 This report provides an update on progress against the Joint Waste Committee (JWC) action plan to February 2018.

## 2. Action plan 2017/20

- 2.1 The current action plan was agreed by the JWC on 21 February 2017 (Agenda item 7) and sets out a three year work programme. Appendix 1 provides a summary of progress to February 2018.

## 2.2 Notable achievements include:

- The award of new contracts for the sale of recyclable materials by Cheltenham B.C;
- The introduction of a new and improved kerbside recycling collection service for Cheltenham B.C;
- The development of comprehensive waste and recycling collection service policy and procedures for Tewkesbury B.C;
- The on-going construction of the new Javelin Park Energy from Waste facility; and,
- The delivery of a successful, multi-agency anti-litter campaign within Forest of Dean.

## 2.3 Less progress has been made on:

- Reviewing and establishing how new developments that cross boundaries will be serviced – it is proposed that this work forms part of the benchmarking and options appraisal work to be completed next year as part of the GJWC service alignment project.
- A review of the bulky waste collection service in Tewkesbury – Improvements have been made to the bulky waste collection service, which has reduced the lead times to an acceptable level. A detailed service options review will be carried forward in to the 2018/21 work plan, the aim of which will be to increase reuse and recycling of bulky items.

## **3. Updates from Non-voting Partners**

3.1 Gloucester City Council has provided an update on its recent activity and progress; this is included at appendix 3. Stroud District Council will provide a verbal update to the meeting.
