<b>Agenda Item 7 : Cabinet Response to Council Motion 848 Tree Planting</b>  I am delighted by this latest response to the Climate Emergency, and the target of planting 35 million trees. The Cabinet Member will recall that last year he dismissed the Lib Dem call to deliver more than six million trees over 10 years, claiming that it would not be possible to plant more than one million trees in that time. Can the Cabinet Member confirm why he's had a change of heart?	I welcome your support for our approach. The targets set for tree planting have been set by the Local Nature Partnership (LNP) and the partners they have been working with which includes organisations such as the Woodland Trust in the development of the Gloucestershire Tree Strategy. The targets are very ambitious but our partners are committed to their delivery and we will work closely with them to help achieve the aims of the strategy.

We currently have 106 screens in the Central Severn Vale area including Gloucester Transport Hub and we are planning to invest in more market town locations such as Cirencester.</p>

<p><b>Agenda Item 8: Real Time Passenger Information System</b></p> <p>Can the Cabinet Member confirm what GCC's targets are for increasing public transport usage in its commitment to make Gloucestershire carbon neutral by 2050?</p>	<p>The adopted LTP has a target to increase use of bus (LTP PI-9). This is reported on in the annual LTP progress reports.</p>

<p><b>Agenda Item 7 : Cabinet Response to Council Motion 848 Tree Planting</b></p> <p>What's the total number of trees on the county's highways?</p>	<p>The total number of highway trees is difficult to determine precisely – historical estimates put the figure around 30,000 but recent work to assess the level of ash die back (there are an estimated 36,000 ash trees which are highway trees) indicate that the overall figure is much higher. There are 13,059 trees which fall in our high priority inspections such as Cheltenham, Gloucester and the market town areas. On the remainder of the 3,300 mile network the majority of trees are not highway trees, they are the riparian responsibility of the adjacent landowner. These are visually inspected on a lower</p>

Of those trees removed, how many were replaced, and what is the net total?	For 19/20 over 200 trees were planted with the majority being within Cheltenham and Gloucester. Figures for 17/18 and 18/19 are not immediately available and will be provided separately.
